

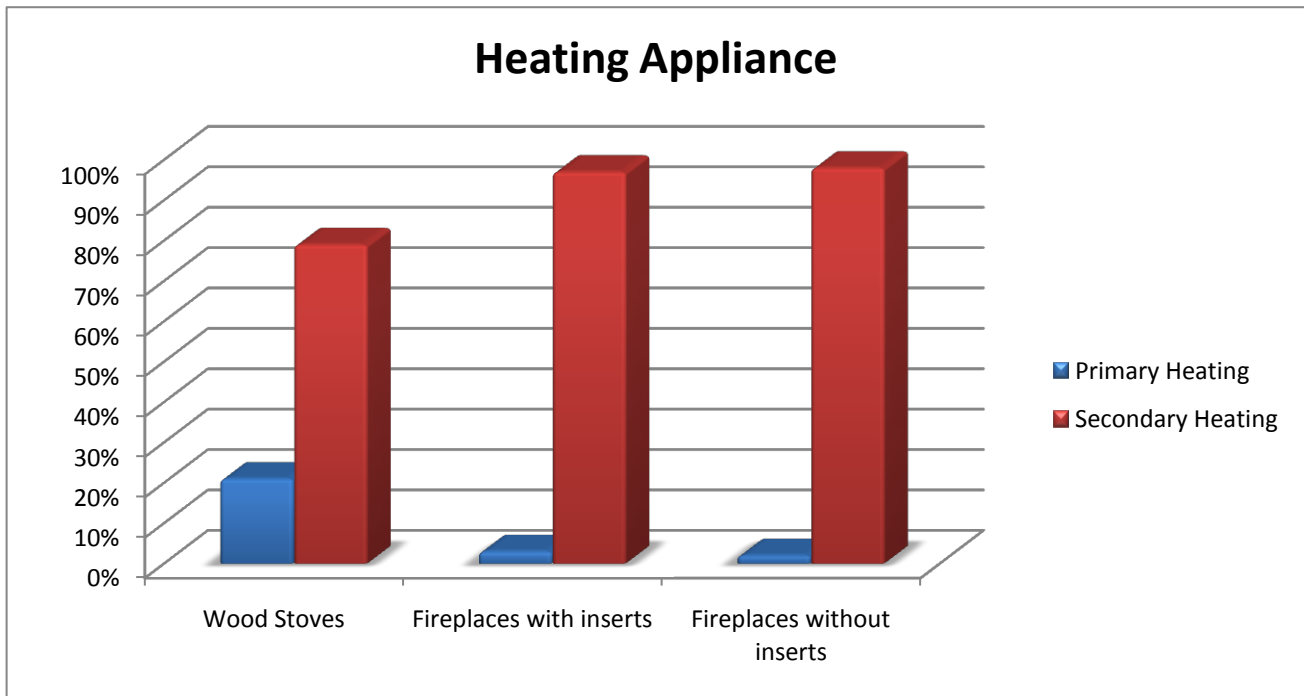
## US Census Numbers of Wood Heating Appliances

The below tables contain US Census numbers for primary and secondary wood burning heating appliances. These numbers were derived from Table 1-4 of the 2005 American Housing Survey (AHS) national data, which contains the number of households with each type of heating appliance. The year (2005) is currently the latest year available that contains information on both household primary and secondary heating appliances. The number of households, with any of the three individual types of wood burning heating appliances, was multiplied by the average number of each type of heating appliance per household. The per household numbers are 1.09, 1.10, and 1.17 for wood stoves, fireplaces without inserts, and fireplaces with inserts, respectively, and they were obtained from the US Consumer Products Safety Commission. 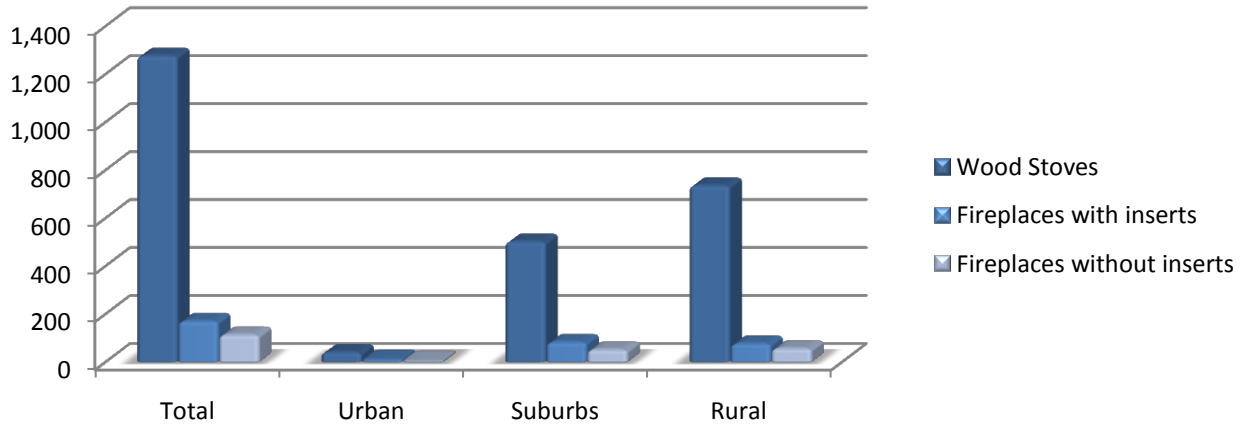
